On **March 28, 2010, Justice Sunday**, we will stand up with Unitarian Universalist congregations nationwide to respond to the Unitarian Universalist Service Committee's call to advance the cause of economic justice. Each year, the Unitarian Universalist Service Committee (UUSC) encourages congregations to dedicate a day to consider a particular theme or need. This year's theme is economic justice, a topic deeply affecting people around the globe and even here in Collin County. How can we put our UU principles into action and move the world closer to justice?

The UUSC is a social justice organization that is financially independent from the UUA and the federal government. It focuses on areas of significant need, providing education, support and advocacy to people and organizations around the world and focusing support primarily on the most vulnerable of communities.

As of February 15, the UUSC reported having received a remarkable \$988,369 in donations toward the relief fund for victims of earthquake in Haiti. Many thanks to those of you who already donated to that effort. Also, many thanks to those who donated toward the UUSC's *Guest at Your Table* program which we offered earlier in the year. I am relieved to know that there is an organization on the frontline of justice that embodies my ethics and beliefs and, for me, maintaining my membership to the UUSC is an important part of how I live out my own faith.

On March 28, at our Justice Sunday service, we will not collect a second offering. The focus instead will be on increasing our awareness and finding out how this theme connects to us. In lieu of a second offering, I take this moment to encourage you to consider joining me in becoming a member of the UUSC. I have been very inspired by the many workers for justice at Community and I would love to see that dedication toward justice exemplified in the congregation's increased membership to the UUSC. Individual memberships to the UUSC are \$40 (Student \$10 and Seniors \$20). Member contributions make up about 60% of UUSC's annual budget. Congregations with strong membership in the UUSC receive banners at different levels. With increased UUSC

Intentional Caring

Even as I anticipate the turning of the wheel of the year, taking us from winter to spring, I realize that many of us are still dealing with difficult issues and life situations. Part of the church's role is to help us through such times, by direct support and by being a caring and trustworthy community. With so many new and returning guests, friends and members, it is time to offer a review of how we take care of each other as a community and how to access these resources.

As the minister I have a unique pastoral relationship with the members of this religious community, however I am not the only, or even first pastoral or caring relationship available. We are blessed by many dedicated members who make up our Caring Committee's supportive ministry. From our website:

Pastoral care should be a core value in any religious community, and that is especially true when the church defines itself as a community of its members and supporting each other is an important way we support the church. The Reverend Price's many responsibilities include pastoral duties such as visiting congregants in the hospital and counseling church members. However, pastoral concerns often need continuing or longer-term attention. The Caring Committee supports and supplements the minister's efforts, occasionally providing transportation, running errands or preparing a meal. Mostly, however, our volunteers provide a cheerful voice and a sympathetic ear. The Caring Committee is an important ministry of Community UU Church. They would love to have your help. In addition to the Caring Committee's resources, I have a fund of money available through the Minister's Discretionary Account to provide minor financial assistance to members and friends of the church as well as people in the broader community. Please contact me for further information for yourself or someone else.

Overall, the most important thing we can all do to ensure the care we may each need, is to communicate with each other. If the church staff and volunteers do not know about a need or concern, it can not be addressed. The fact is that the grapevine just doesn't work as well as we suppose it does in getting vital information where it needs to go. Dropping a word to someone in the midst of a busy Sunday morning or a passing comment in the hall is not a very certain way to get the message out. So please intentionally call or e-mail me, the Caring Committee and/or the church office with important and/or timely information about needs and concerns for yourself or another. Together we are stronger than we are alone.

Partnership Update for the March newsletter

At our January 24, 2010 multigenerational, multicultural worship service, we celebrated our partnership with Unitarian Universalists Hong Kong (UUHK) with an early celebration of the Chinese New Year. The service drew record attendance and raised approximately \$300 to support future partnership efforts. The service included performances of traditional Chinese instruments (Guzheng and Ehru), a Chinese vocalist who sang the original Chinese lyrics of a tune from our Unitarian Universalist hymnal, Chinese music on recorder from our own Rosemarie Petrich, a story about a Wishing Tree in Hong Kong, and information about traditions of the Chinese New Year and about UUHK. Children received lucky red envelopes each containing a Chinese coin. The service culminated with a joyful postlude of younger children entering the sanctuary with drums that they decorated and with older children entering with lion dancing. After the service, attendees enjoyed a Kung Fu demonstration with swords and a delicious Chinese lunch. It was truly a celebration! We shared pictures and video of our celebration with UUHK who celebrated our partnership on February 6th. We look forward to sharing pictures of their celebration as well.

UUHK has even more reason to celebrate! UUHK founder and president, Alex Szeto, and his wife Flora are new parents! Flora gave birth to a healthy boy on February 8th, 2010. The boy weighs 3.12 kg (6.96 lbs). Alex and Flora named the baby Ryan Szeto, with a Chinese name: 仁 (Ren). 仁 is a key concept in Confucianism, which can be translated as “humanness, benevolence, and kindness.”

A partnership committee has been formed at Community and is working to find ways to deepen our relationship and our experience with UUHK. As the Chair of the RE Board, I would like to express my appreciation for the time Carla has spent with us as our Interim Director of Religious Education. It has been a great pleasure to work with her. She started as Interim DRE in June 2008 knowing that we would be hiring a permanent DRE in a year or two. She hit the ground running and helped us implement the Spirit Play curriculum for young elementary children. She enabled us to try out the new Tapestry of Faith UU curriculum. She met with other DREs, took training classes, and spent many hours writing prospectuses, checking out curricula, recruiting teachers, writing newsletter articles, and finding substitutes at the last minute.

Because Carla's departure was planned from the start, a DRE Search committee was formed last summer to work through the process of hiring a permanent DRE. This committee recently interviewed five prospective DREs, and several of these are very strong candidates. The search committee will soon be making its final selection and expects to introduce the church's first full-time DRE to the congregation in May.
